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ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Annamalai University, one of the largest unitary, teaching, and residential Universities in Southern Asia, was established and incorporated in the year 1929 as per the Annamalai University Act 1928 (Tamil Nadu Act 1 of 1929). Now, the Annamalai University Act, 1928 has been repealed and replaced by the Annamalai University Act 2013 (Tamil Nadu Act 20 of 2013). His Excellency the Governor of Tamil Nadu is the Chancellor of the University. *The University is awarded 'A' Grade by NAAC in December 2014*.

The University is located at Annamalainagar, adjacent to Chidambaram town, the abode of Lord Nataraja, the Cosmic Dancer. The University, since its inception, has played a pivotal role in providing access to higher education to thousands of youth from economically and socially disadvantaged classes. In this respect, the University's service to the nation is tremendous. In past 88 years, the University has grown into a premier institution of higher learning and research. The sprawling and scenic campus, spread over an extensive area of about 800 acres has the Faculties of Arts, Science, Indian Languages, Engineering and Technology, Education, Fine Arts, Agriculture, Medicine, Dentistry and Marine Sciences.

All the ten faculties enjoy reputation across the globe for their distinguished record of effective teaching at the higher level, continuing research and develop human resources. Numerous infrastructure facilities have been created to cater to all the students enrolled in the various on-campus programmes. New laboratory facilities in terms of space and equipment have been provided to satiate the needs of the learners and researchers. Video conferencing, Edusat, campus wide network with 1750 access points, high tech class rooms are some of the facilities added.

The University Library, named after the eminent scholar, statesman and former Vice-Chancellor Dr. Sir C.P. Ramaswami Aiyer, serves as knowledge hub for the students and the staff. Quite a good number of journals can be accessed through the Infonet facility. Science Direct is subscribed through which 340 journals can be accessed.

The sports pavilion of the University, with an area of over 6.5 acres, houses facilities for sports and games. Tennis court complex, basketball complex, volleyball complex, athletic standard track, cricket field & nets, football field, hockey field and a wooden floored indoor stadium are a few worth mentioning.

1. FACULTY OF DENTISTRY

The RAJAH MUTHIAH DENTAL COLLEGE was established in the year 1980. The Rajah Muthiah Institute of Health Sciences building housing this Dental College was constructed at a cost of about `4 crores and was declared open on 28.4.1988 by His Excellency Shri R. Venkataraman the then President of India. It accommodates both the Dental College with the Dental Hospital and the Medical Wing. Two hostels each for men and women students, staff-quarters and other amenities have been provided in the campus. The institution celebrated its Silver Jubilee in Nov. 2005. As a self-supporting institution, it has to necessarily raise adequate resources through fees that represent the economic cost of dental education imparted to the students of the College.

Out-patient and in-patient facilities are provided including a modern and well equipped operation theatre. The post-graduate training has been specially planned with adequate infrastructure.

The Rajah Muthiah Dental College & Hospital has excellent infrastructural facilities reflecting the latest developments in Dentistry including an imported casting and ceramic laboratory. Recently, the Dental College has upgraded its infrastructure by adding the following facilities.

- 1. New block for specialities in Orthodontics and Periodontics.
- 2. Two well-equipped A/C Lecture Halls with a capacity for 250 persons.
- 3. R.V.G. System and Intra oral camera facilities.
- 4. Teseera ATL composite crown and bridge system.
- 5. Vector unit for periodontal treatment.
- 6. A complete VIP clinic with latest state-of-art Technologies.
- 7. Centrally Air conditioned Library with separate Post Graduate and staff sections.
- 8. A latest, fully equipped Mobile Dental Clinic with two Dental chairs for Rural Dental Camps and School Camps routinely conducted by the Division of Community Dentistry
- 9. **A full-fledged IMPLANT CLINIC** with a complete set of latest equipments and 3 internationally renowned Implant systems available for implant treatment.

The hospital is well equipped with sufficient number of state-of-the-art Dental chairs and other latest equipment enabling provision of modern dental care to a large number of patients from rural areas. The hospital also organises routine Dental Camps with a fully equipped mobile clinic in the surrounding villages.

The Faculty is self-sufficient with its own library which is located in the second floor of the college. The Library is centrally air conditioned with 3974 sq. feet space to accommodate 80 students. The Library is kept open from 9.00 am to 8.00 pm on all working days. Adequate fund is being allotted every year towards purchase of Medical & Dental books and also for journals as recommended by Dental Council of India. The Library provides access to Journals, National and International, Back Volumes and a commendable collection of text books and reference books.

The institution, recognized as one of the select Dental Colleges offering quality education, works with a singular mission for transforming itself into a Centre of Excellence.

A special feature of Rajah Muthiah Dental College & Hospital is that it is one of the very few Dental Colleges in India directly run by Universities. As a University Dental College with residential system, there are ample opportunities for healthy interaction and learning from multi-disciplinary facilities available in the campus of the Annamalai University.

The Post Graduate degree programmes in 8 different specialities are being offered presently and recognised by Dental Council of India.

2. POST-GRADUATE PROGRAMMES OFFERED

2.1 Duration Of The Programme

The duration of Post-Graduate degree programme is Three years.

(During the study period the student is entitled to a maximum leave of 30 working days only in a year).

3. METHOD OF SELECTION

Candidates who are interested in joining these courses at Rajah Muthiah Dental College, Annamalai University, for the academic year 2017-2018 must have secured the minimum qualification score in **National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET)** held from 30th November – 3rd December 2016 conducted by the National Board of Examination, New Delhi. The candidates should apply and also appear for the counselling to be conducted by the Selection Committee, Directorate of Medical Education, Government of Tamil Nadu, Kilpauk, Chennai, the dates of which will be announced by the Selection Committee.

4. SECURITY AMOUNT

Non-service candidates shall execute a bond with three sureties for a sum of 5,00,000/- (Rupees Five Lakhs only) for Post Graduate Degree Programmes of the year 2017-2018 session with an undertaking, that they shall serve Annamalai University for a period not less than one year, if required. During the above bond period, they will be paid the salary on consolidated basis on par with that of fresh recruits as in force at the time of completion of Post Graduate Degree. Two sureties should be provided one of which should be from a permanent government/public servant in the same or higher rank than the candidate and other surety should be from the spouse/parent of the candidate. PAN numbers of the sureties should be furnished. The prescribed form of bond will be made available by the Annamalai University at the time of admission. The bond will become infructuous on serving, the RMDCH for a minimum period of one year.

5. DOCUMENTS THAT SHOULD BE SUBMITTED AT THE TIME OF ADMISSION

The following documents should be enclosed with each application.

Please note **only attested copies** need to be attached.

- 1. Allotment Order
- 2. Date of Birth Certificate (H.Sc. Certificate/School Leaving Certificate)
- 3. Community Certificate (if applicable)
- 4. Consolidated statement of BDS Marks from I to Final Year
- 5. CRRI Completion Certificate
- 6. BDS Degree/Provisional Pass Certificate issued by the University.
- 7. Candidates must have a degree of B.D.S. of 5 years duration of Annamalai University or an equivalent qualification recognised by Dental Council of India.
- 8. Must have registered with any of the State Dental Councils in the Country as a Registered Dental Practitioner recognised by Dental Council of India. (Evidence to be produced)
- 9. Only those who have completed the Compulsory Rotatory Residential Internship on or before **31.03.2017** are eligible for admission.
- 10. 3 Numbers of Passport size photographs.
- 11. Bond in the prescribed format as stipulated under para 4 (only for Non-service candidates).
- 12. The Candidate and his/her parent should execute a Notary Affidavit in the prescribed format at the time of admission regarding the fee structure and payment of course fee.

All originals are to be produced only at the time of admission.

6. STIPEND

The candidates admitted to various Post Graduate Degree Programmes during the academic year 2017-2018 will be paid stipend as detailed below:

7. ADMISSION TO HOSTEL

Hostel accommodation is compulsory. Admission to the hostels will be provided on payment of `75,000/- (Rupees Seventy Five Thousand) exclusive of `10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) refundable deposit, towards boarding and lodging for one academic year.

The KRM Men's Hostel is very near to the Rajah Muthiah Medical College complex and is located just across the road, hardly 100 metres away. KRMH is a complete hostel with all in-built facilities like indoor games room, recreation rooms, reading room, gymnasium. It also encloses a volley ball and a basketball court inside. The hostel mess, like all other mess in the University, is provided with a mineral water plant operating on reverse osmosis system to provide safe and clean drinking water to all the students. Besides, the hostels also have facility for providing cable/dish connection for those who are desirous of having access to entertainment. Further, arrangements are afoot to provide Wi-Fi connection to the hostel.

8. GENERAL NOTE TO APPLICANTS/SELECTED CANDIDATES OF ALL PROGRAMMES

- 1. The candidates are informed that Ragging in any form is totally banned/ prohibited and anyone found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging is liable to be punished appropriately. Attention of the candidates is invited to the Notification of the Regulations 2009 issued by the Medical Council of India in this regard. The students are required to give an undertaking at the time of admission.
- 2. In the case of students who have joined the programme of study but discontinued without attending class, the payment of fees for the remaining period of study will be waived, if the seats vacated by them are filled up in the same academic year. The fees already paid to the university will also be returned to such students. However, the Bond Breakage amount along with a service charge of Rupees Ten Thousand will have to be paid to the University by that students.
- 3. For the above category of students, if the seats vacated by them are not filled up in the same academic year, they have to pay the fees for the remaining period of study, apart from paying the Bond Breakage amount to University.
- 4. In the case of students who discontinue the programme after attending classes, the fees paid by them for the year will not be returned. If the seats vacated by them are filled up subsequently in the same academic year, they will be exempted from paying the fees for the remaining period of their study but, they would have to pay the Bond Breakage amount to the University.
- 5. For the above category of students mentioned in 4, if the seats vacated them are not filled up in the same academic year, they have to pay the full fee for the remaining period of their study, in addition to the Bond Breakage amount to University.
- 6. In the case of students who discontinue the programme of study in the middle of the programme in the subsequent years, the fee for the remaining period of the study have to be paid them in addition to the Bond Breakage amount to the University. All the discontinuing students, in the 1st year have to deposit the entire fees for the remaining year of the programme of study with the University, and the money deposited will be returned to them only after filling up of the seats vacated by them.

- 7. i. Tuition fees for each academic year should be paid well before the due date, failing which a fine as prescribed by the University will be charged. The candidate shall not be permitted to appear for the University examination without clearing the tuition fees arrears.
 - ii. Tuition fees for the entire programme together with arrears, if any, shall be payable by the student before Transfer Certificate is issued.
- 8. Caution deposit shall be refunded after adjustment towards any dues from the student.
- 9. With regard to any dispute arising in relation to admission, examinations, remittance of fees, etc., the place of jurisdiction for the purpose of filing a suit or preferring a complaint or taking any legal proceedings against the Annamalai University, will be Chidambaram Town only.
- 10. No certificate will be issued, unless the candidate has cleared all the arrears of fees etc., due to the University.
- 11. All the candidates selected for the admission for the Annamalai University has to execute a bond as detailed in section 4 (page no. 3) of this prospectus in the format prescribed by the University before admission to Course Compulsorily. (Format is available on University Website / www.annamalaiuniversity.in).

9. CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS OF ALL PROGRAMMES

The following code of conduct shall be observed by the students who are admitted.

- 1) The students should conduct themselves in an exemplary manner so as to be a model for other students.
- 2) All students will have to strictly adhere to the rules and regulations of the University.
- 3) If any student is involved in ragging or any other anti-social activities, he/she will be expelled and criminal proceedings may be launched against him/her.
- 4) The students should be present during all working days and sincerely apply themselves to studies.
- 5) The students should attend the classes regularly and punctually. A minimum attendance of 80% in compulsory to appear for the University Examinations.
- 6) The campus is "Tobacco Free" and "Liquor Free". Deviants will face dismissal from the programme.
- 7) Using mobile phones inside the faculty premises is strictly prohibited.
