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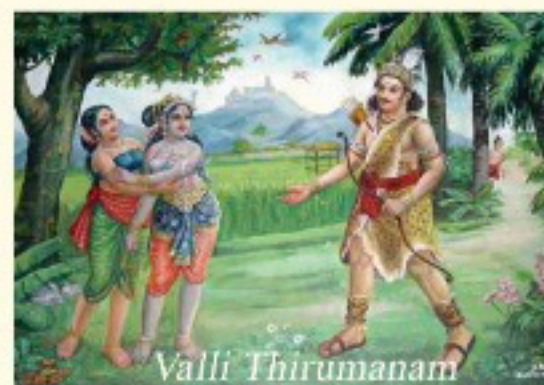

ANNAMALAI UNIVERSITY

Annamalai University with a sprawling campus of nearly 1000 acres is one of the largest residential Universities in Southern Asia comprising of 10 Faculties and 49 departments of study located at Chidambaram: the Abode of the Cosmic Dancer Lord Nataraja. In the early 1920s, to serve the downtrodden and to promote Tamil Literature, Rajah Sir S.R.M. Annamalai chettiar founded Sri Minakshi College, Sri Minakshi Tamil College and Sri Minakshi Sanskrit College in a rural setup at Chidambaram. In 1928, Rajah Sir S.R. M. Annamalai Chettiar agreed with the local Government to handover the above said institution for establishing a University. thus, on 01.01.1929 Annamalai University was established as per Annamalai University Act 1928 (Tamil Nadu Act 1 of 1929). Ever since its establishment, Annamalai University has played an incredible role in the lives of the people near and far. In 2013, the Annamalai University Act, 2013 (Tamil Nadu Act 20 of 2013), was passed and has come into force from September 25, 2013.

Being a unitary, multi-faculty institution, Annamalai University has evolved as a time-tested system of administration to ensure the ceaseless transaction of teaching-learning, boundless expansion of research and innovation, and selfless extension of service to the society. Availability of ten diverse disciplines and 49 departments of study along with useful facilities and favourable climate for learners and teachers.

THE CENTRE FOR RURAL DEVELOPMENT

The Centre for Rural Development was established in 1989 and it acts as a Nodal Agency in coordinating development activities to ensure overall Rural Development in the rural neighborhood of the University with the active involvement of the rural communities. The Centre also promotes Research & Extension Programmes devoted to training young men and women to take up Rural Development as a mission. The Centre for Rural Development offers Two Post-Graduate Programmes, M.Phil. and Ph.D. Programmes in Rural Development. The Centre has Conducted Two UGC National Level Refresher Courses in Rural Development. One of the milestones of the Centre for Rural Development is in the History of Annamalai University, for the First Time, Centre for Rural

Development has conducted Ten Day Research Methodology Course for Ph.D Scholars during January 2014. 15 National Seminars/Conferences, 4 Workshops, and One International Conference. It is a nascent Centre of Learning, Teaching and Social Engagements, which produced 26 Ph.Ds and 45 M.Phils in Rural Development. It has undertaken 12 Action based Research Projects of worth Rs.100 lakhs and published 120 Research Papers. Regarding Rural Extension Activities, the Farmers' Clubs is a unique concept, in order to serve the cause of the society. To promote Rural Livelihood Security, the Centre has organized 63 Meet with Expert Programmes, 70 Skill Development Training Programmes and Village Camps in 72 Adopted Villages. with the co-operation of Banks, NABARD, UGC, ICSSR, Tamil Nadu State Planning Commission, State Institute of Rural Development & Panchayat Raj and DRDA Cuddalore.

THE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE
